## What You Might Observe

- performance in the "average range" or struggling academically
  - phonemic awareness or auditory processing of language, reading accuracy, fluency, spelling, writing
- poor working memory and processing speed
- oral language-substitutions
- Creative
- Good comprehension verbal, listening, and reading
- Critical thinkers

## Programs and Strategies for Optimal Learning

- Identify and focus on strengths Strength-based, talent-focused programs
  - Provide instruction slightly above the present performance level
  - Remediation of weaknesses balanced by work in areas of strengths
- Systematic and sequential phonics and phonemic awareness programs (based on Orton-Gillingham or structured literacy education)
- Encourage different thinking let children think outside the box and be creative
- Small-group instruction for individual needs
- Instruction in learning styles and study skills
- Internal and external supports for behavioral and social interventions
- Provide alternate means and accommodations to access information, express ideas, and create products
- Methods that work for gifted dyslexic children are suitable for all children

## Interview Questions to Help with Listening to the Child's Voice (Gabrielli, 2020)

- What's one thing you wish...
  - you could study in school?
  - o your teachers/family knew or understood about you?
- What activities do you get lost in?
- What do you look for in a friend?
- What three words would you use to describe yourself?
- Is there anything about school that makes you nervous or anxious?
- What problems (in the community or world) would you like to help solve?

## **Helpful Accommodations**

- A copy of class notes before teaching the content/note-takers/recorded lectures
- Assistive technology (speech-to-text and text-to-speech)
- Graphic organizers to help with notes and remembering facts
- ► Focus on the content of what was written, not spelling or grammar
- Differentiation (instruction, assessments)
- Compaction/acceleration in strength areas
- Hands-on learning opportunities
- Social/emotional support
- Mentoring/apprenticeships (expert instruction/real-world work)
- More time (tasks/instruction/college matriculation)
- Collaboration (special education, general education, gifted education, parents, professional)
